Farmers' Market Celebrates 5th Anniversary

Farmers' markets are as much about sustainable community as they are about sustainable agriculture. Consumers have lost touch with those who grow their food as much as the farmers have lost contact with the people who eat it. A farmers' market is the best place we know to reconnect with your food, the people who work hard to produce it, and your neighbors, all in one visit.

Our original market began in the parking lot of the Ace Hardware store in 2006 and was the brainchild of Judy Hardin – current owner of RabbitEars on Fairmont Avenue. And although she no longer works at the market, she can be seen every Sunday walking the aisles on Oak View Avenue buying loads of fresh organic greens for her rabbits and other creatures, big and small. From 2006 to 2008 the market was sponsored by KCC under their non-profit umbrella. It continued to expand and contract in the limited space of a parking lot, with its slight starboard tilt.

In May of 2008 the market found a new home, and a new farmer to sponsor it. We found ourselves on a full block of flat, open street at Oak View Avenue and Colusa. This new location allowed the market to offer better access to adjoining communities, and gave us room to invite more vendors to participate. Its current success is a perfect example of "If you build it they will come."

Refuse Rate Redux

Dear Outlook Editor,

My first thought when I heard that Bay View Refuse wanted a rate increase was, "What a bunch of baloney!" Then, the more I thought about it, I ended up being sympathetic to BVR. As a retired general contractor, I am all too familiar with bids, contracts, and fixed prices. They are unrealistic for contractors and for refuse companies. A major cost item for BVR is gasoline. How could Bay View have known that fuel prices would escalate by over 25% in a period of months? Who's "right" and who's "wrong" here? Well, I don't know the answer to that, but I do know that BVR gives us very good service. I know that Kensington is the only community around where customers do not have to place their cans for the convenience of the trash company. I do not want to see Bay View go and be at the mercy at some anonymous, mega trash collection company. My recommendation: negotiate a settlement with BVR.

Food Sovereignty

Lifting Local Food Production restrictions. Bee keeping, chicken raising: Currently these activities are restricted or prohibited in Kensington and other parts of Contra Costa County. These restrictions have damaged the ability of local citizens to aid pollination of productive plants, such as cold tolerant avocados by the using of bees, which are necessary to produce fruit in these highly desirable plants.

In the case of chickens it just makes no sense to not be able to have egg producing hens – six would be an adequate number to enable sensible production of food without interfering with neighbors. The common complaint regarding chickens is the early morning crowing of roosters, which are not necessary for egg production – and is merely a red herring, which is promoted by large-scale poultry

Four to six hens are not unclean and they produce a very rich fertilizer for other food plants and garden flowers. We can buy this fertilizer at Home Depot and spread it on our lawn and mix it into our vegetable and flower beds, but current industry serving prohibitions on chickens are forcing us to buy it at greatly inflated prices from Suisun City, in Solano County. This year, the prices of garden supplies have been jacked up by 19 1/2 % – from \$7.49 at Kensington Ace Hardware to \$8.95 for a 2 cubic foot bag of planting mix.

It is time to we citizens stand up to agribiz lobbyists and lift these restrictions and get our locally elected representatives such as Supervisor John Gioia to promote the needs of our local citizens by refusing to yield to the demands of the agribusiness conglomerates and their private profit machines and allow us to raise chickens and keep bees.

The fungus-like water mold that carries the disease now is established in East Bay Regional Parks from El Sobrante to Oakland, and has been confirmed in North Berkeley.

For free training in how to protect specific trees, go to nature.berkeley.edu/garbelotto/english/sodtreatmenttraining.php. For general information on sudden oak death, including prevention, go to www.suddenoakdeath.org.

Loss of our coastal oaks would mean much more than loss of beauty – or property values. Danger from fire and falling limbs of trees will increase. Many birds and wild animals depend on oaks; their food and shelter would be affected, as would our watersheds and water cycle. Please help slow this plague's spread.

After a year and a half at the new location the vendors opted to hold an election to see if they would choose a new board and see if they wanted to choose a new manager to run the market. They did, and the Kensington Farmers' Market Association was replaced with the Kensington Community Market Board in November of 2010. The new board, spearheaded by Kensington residents Meryl Natchez,

The more successful the market becomes. the more great vendors want to be a part of it. In just one year we have gone from a market that had to actively recruit vendors, to one that is continually sought out by farmers and food purveyors (cur-







RESOLUTION NO. 2011-008

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENSING-TON POLICE PROTECTION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESS-MENTS FOR THE KENSINGTON PARK ASSESSMENT DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011/12

The Board of Directors of the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District (hereafter referred to as the "Board of Directors") does resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors previously completed its proceedings in accordance with and pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, Part 2, Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code (commencing with Section 22500) (the "Act") to establish the Kensington Park Assessment District (the "Assessment District"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has retained NBS for the purpose of assisting with the annual levy of the Assessment District, and the preparation and filing of an Annual Report.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Intention: The Board of Directors hereby declares its intention to levy and collect assessments within the Assessment District to pay the costs of the Improvements for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2011 and ending June 30, 2012. - 2. Improvements: The improvements within the District include, but are not limited to: the operating, maintaining and servicing of all public landscaping improvements, consisting of landscaping and grass. Operating, maintaining and servicing include, but are not limited to: personnel, materials, electrical energy and water. Services provided include all necessary service, operations, administration and maintenance required to keep the improvements in a healthy, vigorous, and satisfactory condition.
- 3. Assessment District Boundaries: The boundaries of the Assessment District are as shown by the assessment diagram filed in the offices of the Secretary, which map is made a part hereof by reference.
- 4. Annual Report: Reference is made to the Annual Report prepared by NBS, on file with the Secretary, for a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the Assessment District and the zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the Assessment District.
- 5. Notice of Public Hearing: The Board of Directors hereby declares its intention to conduct a Public Hearing concerning the levy of assessments in accordance with Section 22629 of the Act. All objections to the assessment, if any, will be considered by the Board of Directors. The Public Hearing will be held on Thursday May 12, 2010 at 7:00 pm or as soon thereafter as is feasible in the meeting place of the Board of Directors located at 59 Arlington Avenue, Kensington, CA. The Board of Directors further orders the Secretary to publish notice of this resolution in accordance with Section 22626 of the Act.
- 6. Increase of Assessment: The maximum assessment is not proposed to increase from the previous year above that previously approved by the property owners (as "increased assessment" is defined in Section 54954.6 of the Government Code).


