## Stege tells homesellers to pour money down the drain

Stege Sanitary District has imposed new rules that could delay homesales and require homeowners to spend thousands of dollars on replacing damaged pipes before they can sell their homes.

The new ordinance from the district, which collects wastewater in Kensington, El Cerrito and parts of the Richmond Annex, takes effect September 6.

It requires that prior to the close of escrow on the sale of a home in its service area the owner of the property obtain a certificate of compliance for their sewer line. The homeowner must pay a contractor to perform a video inspection of the line tp show it is not damaged and submit it to the district for review.

If the district finds the line is out of compliance it would require repair or replacement of the line, which could cost thousands of dollars. The district said the measure is needed to reduce the amount of rainwater that enters the system through broken pipes.

"The main goal is to stop all of the infiltration of rainwater into the system and reduce our overflows during rainy season," said Arvin Gonzales, engineer and tech inspector for Stege. "It's a big problem and a lot of agencies are looking to doing this."

The new ordinance from Stege follows similar measures already instituted by sanitary districts in Albany and Alameda. Other districts are considering taking similar steps.

The sewer lateral that the homeowner is responsible for begins at the connection at the home and runs all the way to the point that it connects to the sewer main, beyond the homeowners property. That means to do a full replacement could require permits to tear up public streets at the property owner's expense.

Most homes in the district predate 1950 and still rely on their original sewer laterals. These pipe, often made of clay, can crack and become disjointed and damaged by a variety of causes from the ground shifting to tree roots intruding. Many of these lines are without cleanouts that provide access for clearing blockages.

Stege said certificantes of compliance issued to sewer laterals that have been replaced will be honored for ten years in most cases, even if the property is sold or there are major improvements or the owner makes major improvements to the home.

The real estate community is lobbying Stege to alter the new rule to provide buyers and sellers the flexibility afforded by other jurisdictions to negotiate who will take responsibility for the work or allow proof of a contract with an approved contractor to satisfy the requirements

so a sale could close escrow.

Todd Hodson, co-owner of Marvin Gardens Real Estate said if the purpose of the ordinance is to reduce the output of water from the system into the San Francisco Bay there are more effective means of accomplishing that.

"If it's so important, why make it so haphazard?" said Hodson, who thinks the district could use a more methodical approach to addressing the problem than just tying it to the transfer of property.

There is also a question of how effective the new rule will be, particularly if the housing market remains hot and sellers are willing to close on escrow without the certification from the sanitary district. The ordinance contains no penalties or enforcement measures.

"It's too early to tell how it will all play out," said Hodson.

# Making the grade



#### Supes approve amended event ordinance

The Contra Costa Board of Supervisors approved a proposed events ordinance that is expected to bring to an end the ongoing dispute between concert promoter turned philanthropist Danny Scher and neighbors over fundraising concerts at his Kensington home.

The board of supervisors in August approved the ordinance 4-1 with several amendments. Because of the amendments, the ordinance must be sent back to the Planning Commission and then return to the board of supervisors for a final vote.

Supervisor Gayle Ukilkema was the only opposing vote because she believed the ordinance would permit commercial events in residential areas.

If the Planning Commission approves the changes and it wins final approval with the board of supervisors, the ordinance

would limit the number of events to three in any 12-month period Scher or any other person in an unincorporated area in the county could hold.

Schools, churches and public property are exempted from the ordinance, which means events such as the KCC Annual Parade and Open House and the Kensington Education Foundation's Garden Party would be free from the permit requirements of the new law.

Among the restrictions that would be put in place are limits on the number of people able to attend a given event. Residents who opposed the legislation were disappointed that the board failed to adopt more stringent measures than the 300 people for one event and 200 people for two events per year the law allows.
