WELCOME, PARENTS, TO KENSINGTON AFTER SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM'S SPRING 2020 SESSION

All Hilltop students, grades 1-6, walk themselves down the hill to attend KASEP classes. Students who are enrolled in Neighborhood School are escorted up to Neighborhood School after their KASEP class by KCC staff.

KINDERGARTEN ENRICHMENT CLASSES EVERY DAY AFTER SCHOOL

*Kindergarten KASEP classes start at 1:30pm and end at 2:20pm
Registration is Tuesday, March 3rd at 7:00pm
Classes begin Monday, March 16th*

KASEP kindergarten teachers pick up the kinder students directly from their school classroom and walk them to their KASEP classroom down the hill. At the end of the Kinder KASEP class, KCC staff will walk Neighborhood School students up to Neighborhood School.

Parents or guardians of kindergartners who are not attending Neighborhood School must come to sign out their children on the roll sheet in the classroom.

KINDERGARTEN CLASSES FOR THE SPRING SESSION

KASEP and KCC offer a great selection of classes for kindergartners which speaks to our incredible and talented KASEP and KCC teachers. Your kindergartner can learn to build things with clay, make yummy muffins, learn basic gymnastics skills, discover more about the world around them with hands-on activities, enjoy all kinds of fun games and sports, try out a variety of wonderful arts and crafts, and even learn some Math or Mandarin.

POLICY FOR REPEAT ENROLLMENTS DURING ONLINE REGISTRATION:

We want to give everyone an opportunity to enroll in one of the following highly desirable/always full classes.

Artful Animals for Kindergartners Wednesdays 1:30

Carpentry for Kindergartners Tuesdays 1:30 - not offered in Spring

Carpentry Tuesdays 2:30 and Wednesdays 1:50 - not offered in Spring

Chocolatier Creations and Decorations Wednesdays 1:50

OUR POLICY: starting in the Fall session of KASEP each year, if you are enrolled in any of the above classes in the FALL, you cannot re-enroll in that class again for the Winter Session. Likewise, if you are enrolled in any of these classes in Winter, you cannot enroll in the same class for the Spring session. This hopefully allows everyone the opportunity to enroll in every class, even the more popular ones.

PLEASE NOTE that Carpentry classes are not offered in the Spring Session.

THIS POLICY DOES NOT APPLY TO OTHER KASEP CLASSES - music, language, sports, cooking, keyboard, or art classes. You may enroll in any of these classes, in each session, on a first come, first serve basis. Class size is limited.

PHOTO RELEASE:

Occasionally KCC may take photos of students or their work and publish them in the Outlook, our local newspaper, online as part of our brochure, and for public relations purposes. We will not publish the names of students.

CLASS PRICES:

KASEP class prices include materials fees, instructor fees and administrative costs. The price of the class varies based on the length of the class and the number of weeks the class meets during the session. The Spring session of KASEP is 9 weeks: 9 Mondays, 9 Tuesdays, 9 Wednesdays, 9 Thursdays and 9 Fridays.

WAITLIST:

Once a class is fully enrolled, you may put your child on the waitlist for that class. No payment is required when you are waitlisted. If there is a cancellation, the first person on the waitlist will be called and given 24 hours to respond.

TIP- good to know! The first two names on the waitlist for each class will have the opportunity to pre-register for that class the following session. Children on more than one waitlist may only register for one class. Waitlist does not carry over to the next school year.

LATE PICK-UP FEE:

There will be a late fee of \$20 for each 10 minutes that a parent or guardian is late to pick up their child.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIP DONATIONS:

KASEP offers more than 50 different classes per week for children ages 5-12. The Scholarship Donation Fund offers access to families who would not otherwise have the opportunity to enroll in a KASEP class without your generosity and kindness. It is only with your financial support that KCC can sustain this commitment to help provide scholarships to others. Donations are accepted by check, cash or credit card. KCC awards 4 scholarships per session. To apply for a scholarship, contact KCC/ KASEP office, 510-525-0292. Application deadline is March 6th.

PAYMENT

KASEP classes are filled on a space available basis, first come first serve. All classes require you to register before the first day of instruction.

Full payment is due at registration. Payment may be made with a credit card only. We accept MasterCard and Visa credit cards. Credit card fees will be applied at check out.

PLEASE NOTE: This payment process has changed from Winter KASEP registration - parents need to revisit their Curacubby account payment profile and enter a valid credit card. We no longer accept payment via a bank transfer or debit direct from a designated bank account.

Cash and check payments can only be made in the KCC office. Please make checks payable to KCC and write class title and child's name on check. A \$30.00 fee will be charged for all returned checks. If money is owed from a previous session, you cannot enroll in KASEP until your outstanding balance is paid.

REFUND POLICY

If a KASEP class or KCC class is canceled due to low enrollment, a full refund will be processed, and you will be mailed a check for the full amount of the class. Allow 30 days to receive your refund check.

If you cancel or change a class during the first week of KASEP, email your request to KCC at kccrec@yahoo.com. There will be no charge to cancel or change a class the first week of the session.

If you want to cancel your child from a KASEP class or KCC class after the first week of classes, you must submit a written request by email to KCC at kccrec@yahoo.com. After the first week of classes, any cancellation request will require you to pay a prorated amount for the classes your child already attended and an additional \$25.00 administration fee. A refund check will be processed and mailed to you. Allow 30 days for the refund.

CREDIT POLICY

If you cancel a class after week 1, you may apply the money spent on the current session's class and request a credit be applied to your account to pay for a class in the next session's registration. Credits follow the academic school year and do not carry forward to summer camp or to the following school year.




